We are pleased to say that restoration works are underway on the second train carriage, hardwood frames are being made in The Shed at The Pier by the volunteer joiners and carpenters.

Removal of the existing flooring is also underway, exposing the metal sub frame where engineers from Blue Funnel Ferries can fully check on the condition and report their findings. We do not expect any major issues after the initial survey.

Overall a successful day giving us a chance to reconnect with our community.



This month in History - August

Hythe Sailing Club Regatta – Tuesday August 27th 1895

The Hythe Sailing Club wound up its season from its pier head club house with a regatta off Hythe Pier. "Several exciting races were held and the gaily decorated clubhouse and pier with the thronging audience enjoying the brilliant weather were quite a spectacle".

Second Hythe Pier Regatta - Wednesday August 28th 1895

"The mood continued over when again in splendid weather, Hythe Pier was the scene of the second annual regatta".

"All Hythe was en fete, the numerous craft in the vicinity like the crowded pier were decorated with flags and bunting".

It was the water Sir! - Thursday August 8, 1918

Harry Rockey appeared before Hythe Magistrates after having been arrested the previous evening for unruly behaviour including swearing and shouting in New Road, Hythe.

He was found guilty of being drunk and disorderly. In his defence he said that he'd had a glass or two of whisky in Southampton and two glasses of bitter in Hythe but it was the crossing of the water from Southampton that had upset him!

He was fined £1.

Beatniks bring colour to the pier and ferry

The ferry brought over some "bizarre and colourful people" to Hythe on Bank Holiday Monday, August 1, 1960. Very many young people, contemporarily known as "beatniks", were on their way to Beaulieu, hitchhiking or catching a bus to Lord Montagu's 5th Annual Jazz Festival.

There are no reports of unruly behaviour on the boats, pier and train, nor indeed in Hythe, from those passing through,

despite the event descending into chaos when a minority of the crowds of attendees became involved in "the Battle of Beaulieu".

August 1996

White Horse Ferries celebrated the 50^{th} anniversary of the launch of Hotspur IV. Throughout the week August $5^{th} - 11^{th}$ events centred around Hotspur IV took place daily. These included free cakes for passengers and special trips along Southampton Water.

Whilst a fuss was made of the old war horse, her successor, Great Expectations, arrived quietly and took over the role of the main boat, relegating Hotspur IV to stand-by. Hotspur IV survived on the passage for another 18 years.
