Orchard Infant School Fundraising Feat - Alan Titheridge

Pupils of Year 2 at Orchard Infants School in Dibden Purlieu have just completed a "Communities Week", with their chosen project being the Hythe Pier and Train. HPHA Board members Jill Gower and Alan Titheridge went into the classroom to explain to the children why the pier and train is so important to the local community and why so much money is needed to restore it. The pupils really took to the project, involving themselves in understanding what is needed to be done.

Ninety children were in Hythe on Friday February 11th singing in the High Street, visiting Grove Gardens and at the Pier Entrance on Friday11th February with candle holders and postcards among items they made during the week to sell to raise funds for HPHA's restoration programme. Proud parents and friends as well as ferry passengers and Hythe shoppers delighted the children by buying almost everything.

Blue Funnel Ferries in conjunction with Hythe Pier Heritage Association made the train available for each of the 90 pupils to enjoy a ride along the 700 yards Grade II listed pier.

New Forest West MP, Dr. Julian Lewis was on hand to offer his support.

Orchard School Year 2 teacher Andy Bowie said, "Here at Orchard Infant School we truly believe that community is at the heart of everything we do, so much so that it is one of our Core Values in school. For this reason, our Year 2 children decided to embark on a fundraising mission for the Hythe Pier".

It was a pleasure for HPHA to be involved and we can't thank them enough with every penny they raised helping us to secure the pier and its railway for their future .

A grand total of £713 was raised over the course of the week.

This month in History - February by AlanTitheridge

February 6, 1879 - A pier is born!

At a meeting at the Drummond Arms Hotel, confirmation that the Hythe Pier and Hythe and Southampton Ferry Company the necessary funding for the building of the new Hythe Pier had been pledged was announced. The £7,700 project had in fact already begun with a contractor, Messrs Bergheim of London, engaged.



February 12, 1938 – Hotspur III launched

The second of the much loved "Hotspurs" was launched at the Rowhedge Ironworks shipyard in Essex. Hotspur III was to serve on the Hythe – Southampton passage until she was withdrawn and scrapped in 1981.

February 25, 1939 – Pounds, shillings and pence!

The ferry owners balance sheets for week ending Friday February 25th, 1939 reveal on its wages sheet...

Manager Mr. Gordon Finlay earned £6 6s 0d (£420 in 2022)

Asst manager William Arthur Lane earned £4 15s 0d (£325 in 2022)

Ferry Captain Wilf Banks earned £3 18s 4d (£260 in 2022)

Train Driver William Longman earned £3 6s 6d (£225 in 2022)
